

The National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) is accepting enrollment and scholarship applications for the Doctor of Philosophy Program in Governance and Development.

Applications are accepted between February 3<sup>rd</sup> – July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2025.

# 1. Available Scholarships

1.1 Category 1: Recipients will be received.

1) All tuition fees will be waived throughout the program.

2) The recipients will receive financial support for personal expenses: 30,000. - baht per semester and 15,000. - baht per summer semester

1.2 Category 2: Recipients will be exempted from credit fees throughout the program.

1.3 Category 3: Recipients will be waived half of the credit fees throughout the program.

All three Categories of scholarships shall have a duration of 3 years starting from the first day of registered as a student.

# 2. Eligibility Requirements for Scholarships and Applicant Qualifications

2.1 As a minimum qualification applicants must hold a master's degree in any field from a university accredited by the Civil Service Commission of the Royal Thai Government.

2.2 In order to qualify for Category 1 scholarships, applicants must have at least GPA 3.50 (4.00 system) at the master's degree level.

2.3 In order to qualify for Category 2 and Category 3 scholarships, applicants must have at least GPA 3.25 (4.00 system) at the master's degree level.

2.4 Applicants must submit the English proficiency scores to the program. the English language proficiency must be attested through official TOEFL (https://www.ets.org/toefl/) or IELTS (https://www.ielts.org/) scores. In addition to official ETS TOEFL scores, NIDA accepts only TOEFL ITP scores from GSLC at NIDA:

2.4.1) TOEFL (TOEFL ITP) 550 or above (testing only at GSLC NIDA); or

TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) 79 or above; or

IELTS 6.5 or above

(Test scores must not be older than 2 years at the time of submission.)

2.5 The applicants who do not have the English proficiency test scores announced in item (2.4) can submit for scholarships. To be eligible to register, the applicants must obtain a master's degree from an international academic institution where English was the medium of instruction and must not be older than 5 years with a grade point average that meets the specific requirements in items (2.2) and (2.3) at the time of the first term of the student registration.

2.6 Applicants who have graduated from a university outside of Thailand must obtain a Letter of Confirmation on Standard Curriculum for Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from the Commission on Higher Education at the Ministry of Education. **Exceptions:** The applicants who can pass the scholarship qualification will be exempted for enrollment in the additional English language courses.

**NOTE:** Applicants are responsible to check that application forms are complete and make sure that they qualify for admission as announced above. Applicants whose application documents are incomplete or who do not meet the required qualifications will not be considered for admission and may be expelled at any time if found to be in violation of the above qualifications. Any fees paid are non-refundable.

# 3. Rules for scholarship acquisition, scholarship suspension and scholarship reimbursement.

3.1 The recipients of Category 1 education promotion scholarships (full scholarships) must obtain a cumulative grade point average for each semester of not less than 3.50 to be eligible for semester personal allowance. If the cumulative grade point average is below 3.50, they are not eligible for personal expenses support. However, if the cumulative grade point average is not lower than 3.30, all tuition fees will be waived. If they receive a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.30 in any semester, they will not be eligible for the scholarship.

3.2 The recipients of Categories 2 and 3 education promotion scholarships must obtain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.30 in each semester. If they receive a cumulative grade point average below the specified threshold in any semester, they will not be eligible for the scholarship.

3.3 Scholarship recipients will no longer be eligible for the scholarship if they are later found requesting to resign or ceasing to be students. In case they are unable to graduate as specified in the regulations of the National Institute of Development Administration on graduate studies, all scholarship funds received must be returned to the institution.

3.4 If the scholarship recipient resigns or ceases to be a student and is unable to graduate as specified in the regulations of the National Institute of Development Administration on graduate studies or requests cancellation of the scholarship, all funds received must be returned to the institution.

3.5 In the event that the scholarship recipient has to re-register for a particular course, he or she will not be exempted from the tuition fees in the re-enrolled course.

3.6 The scholarship recipient must work for the faculty or the institute for at least 6 hours per week.

3.7 The recipient of this scholarship does not have the right to apply for any other grant of the institution except for thesis publication from the National Budget.

# 4. Conditions for recipients of Category 1 scholarships

4.1 Scholarship recipients will be funded for personal expenses each semester only when they are enrolled in Semesters 1 and 2 for not less than 9 credits per semester or register in accordance with the program study plan. The summer semester requires enrollment of at least 3 credits as regulation for eligible for received scholarship support.

4.2 Scholarship recipients will be exempted from the application fee for the first comprehensive examination only.

4.3 Scholarship recipients will pay for the status maintenance fee if their enrollment exceeds the scholarship period.

4.4 The copyright of the thesis shall be joint copyright between the scholarship recipients and the institution for a period of 5 years. After that, the copyright of the thesis is awarded to the scholarship recipients. If the scholarship recipients take any action, which is considered an infringement of intellectual property rights or any rights, the "recipients" are solely responsible for any damage through the infringement of that right.

4.5 The scholarship recipients shall pay the fees for thesis format examination/E-THESIS information system service.

4.6 The doctoral thesis work must be published or has been accepted for publication in an international journal that has been attended by outside directors (Peer Review) prior to publication. In this regard, international journals must comply with the criteria set forth by the Office of the Civil Service Commission in Higher Education Institutions (OCSC) or the Royal Golden Jubilee Ph.D. Program (RGJPHD), excluding Proceedings.

**NOTE:** Scholarship recipients must follow the regulation of the Announcement of the National Institute of Development Administration On qualifications, criteria, and conditions for education promotion scholarships (announcement number 1286/2564 which be Announced on the 8th of November B.E. 2564 (2021)).
